WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

Health & Safety

Keep It Clean

Diapering, toileting, hand washing and food preparation are critical aspects of an early childhood classroom. This training will provide tools, resources and techniques to address the underlying knowledge, attitude and behavior of child care providers in these areas.

Child Passenger Safety

This course will review the NC laws and regulations regarding the transportation of children specific to the child care industry. Transportation in cars, vans and buses will be covered, with specific child restraint solutions discussed for each.

Recognizing and Responding to the Ill Child

This session will cover skills on daily health checks, exclusion criteria and practices, and communicable diseases.

Fire Safety

This workshop will focus on the state requirements for child care and after-school program compliance for fire safety including exit drills, evacuation procedures and use of fire extinguishers.

Communicable Diseases in Child Care

There are a number of steps which providers and staff of child care homes and centers can take to prevent or reduce the incidents of illness among children and adults in the child care setting. Learn the differences in common infectious diseases and common nuisance diseases.

Medication Administration (Part 1)

This workshop will provide information on rules and regulations of administering medication in a child care setting. (Participant must attend both sessions to receive full credit.)

Medication Administration (Part 2)

This workshop will provide information on rules and regulations of administering medication in a child care setting. (Participant must attend both sessions to receive full credit.)

Fire Extinguisher Training

This course will review the different types of fire extinguishers, maintenance, and proper use of fire extinguishers. Information will be provided on child care requirements. The class will offer a classroom component and finish with a hand-on application segment.

Playground Safety

This workshop is designed to promote greater safety awareness and to provide tips for safety on the playground. Strategies and techniques will be shared.

CPR

(Certification cards will be mailed to participants 2-3 weeks after completing workshop-Alamance only.)

This workshop will teach techniques for saving the lives of infants, children and adults. Certification cards will be issued upon completion.

First Aid

(Certification cards will be mailed to participants 2-3 weeks after completing workshop-Alamance only.)

Keeping children safe is your top priority. Learn how to protect children inside and outside of your child care program, what to do in an emergency, how to stock a first-aid kit, where to call for help and more.

ITS SIDS: Infant & Toddler Safe Sleep and SIDS Risk Reduction in Child Care

This workshop gives child care providers an overview of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, identifies SIDS risk factors and describes ways to reduce the risk of SIDS in child care.

Caring for a Child With Seizures

This workshop will provide knowledge to help providers recognize a seizure and know how to respond appropriately. They will learn how to administer the medication called Diastat.

Field Trip and Transportation Safety (Supervision Series)

Would you like to know how to keep children safe during daily routine transportation or on field trips? This module contains guidelines for appropriate supervision, accurate attendance taking, vehicle inspections and much more.

Eco-Healthy Child Care

Research increasingly shows that the first years of a child's life are critical to shaping their future health and development. In this session you will learn that making small changes can have a big impact on the children in your care. By reducing toxins, you can help prevent illnesses like asthma, certain learning disabilities and even some forms of cancer.

Beyond Band-Aids (Supervision Series)

It's a fact that children at home or in child care will become sick, get hurt, or need to take medicine. Dealing with these situations safely is a serious task. This workshop contains guidelines for responding appropriately to accidents and illnesses.

Emergency Preparedness in Child Care

This workshop will help ensure the health and safety of children in child care facilities. Participants will explore the importance of preparing for different types of emergencies and disasters. Providers will learn how to assess their program's risk and resources, develop and implement a disaster plan, and build a team for effective disaster responses.

Inclusion

Creating a Supportive Learning Environment for Children With Special Needs

This workshop addresses ways to provide quality care and appropriate practices for children with special needs. Techniques and strategies will be shared on how to include all children in everyday classroom activities.

Autism: 25 Tips for Teaching Children With Autism

Teachers will be taken through 25 specific instructions that have helped or would have helped those with autism.

Autism: Understanding Students on the Spectrum; Asperger's Syndrome Part I

Teachers will be introduced to/become familiar with Asperger's Syndrome and the diagnostic criteria for this interesting and elusive disorder.

Autism: Understanding Students on the Spectrum; Asperger's Syndrome Part II

Teachers will be introduced to/become more familiar with Asperger's Syndrome and the diagnostic criteria for this interesting and elusive disorder.

It Can Work: Creating an Inclusive Environment

This workshop will provide ways to help teachers incorporate activities for children with special needs in their inclusive setting.

Opening Doors to Inclusive Programs: Introduction to Inclusion in School-Age Programs

This workshop is an overview of inclusion to provide the participant with a basis of the history of support for children with disabilities (medical model vs. empowerment model), and with a philosophy of inclusion.

Opening Doors to Inclusive Programs: Respectful Accommodations in School-Age Programs

This workshop provides an overview of the philosophy of inclusion and insight into what constitutes a "respectful accommodation." Specific examples of accommodations for children who have various types of disabilities are included.

Accommodations for Children With Autism (School-Age)

This workshop will equip providers with the tools needed to successfully include children with autism spectrum disorders in out-of-school time programs. Participants will learn the "bare facts" about autism and dispel the myths.

Opening Doors to Inclusive Programs: Supporting Positive Behavior in School Age Programs

This workshop will focus on how to prevent negative behaviors before they occur, and how to create environments that offer positive behavior support to children with behavioral challenges.

Opening Doors to Inclusive Programs: Partnering With Families in School Age Programs

This session focuses on developing strategies and skills to make these conversations more productive for everyone...especially the child! Participants will learn how to set the stage for and successfully conduct these difficult conversations with parents.

Infant/Toddler

Language Development and Communication for Infants and Toddlers (beginner's level)

The participants will learn about the developmental milestones of language for birth to three, the science that links relationships to language learning in the first three years, and strategies to support development in this domain for all children including dual language learners.

Infant Toddler Zone (Supervision Series)

This workshop will provide ways to ensure that your environment and procedures will lower the risks of injury, illness, SIDS and other dangers.

Introduction to Infant and Toddler Foundations

This is an introductory training of North Carolina's early learning guidelines for infants and toddlers. You will learn more about what to expect from infants and toddlers and how to support their development and learning.

More Than Just Routine (Infants and Toddlers)

Participants will gain a better understanding and knowledge about how routine caregiving times are opportunities for building relationships and learning, and how these routines are connected to culture and family values.

High-Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers: Assessing Your Environment Using the ITERS-Revised

Using pictures from different infant, toddler and two-year-old classrooms, participants will examine the Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale and discuss indicators in detail. Emphasis will be placed on ways to use the scale to improve learning environments.

Little People, Big Fun: Planning for Individual Needs

Come explore the many different ways infants and toddlers grow and develop. Participants will learn how to create plans that help support each child's learning and a schedule that works for you and the individual needs of the children in your care.

Parents/Families

Building Collaborative Relationships With Families

This workshop will help providers learn how to build partnerships with families and explore strategies to promote healthy child development.

Promoting Healthy Relationships With Families – Focus on Effective Communication

Working with families is essential to providing the optimal care for the children at your facility. Learn strategies to help you approach families about difficult subjects and find out the best way to garner their support for your work.

Building Collaborative Relationships With Families (PCAN)

This workshop will help providers learn how to build partnerships with families and explore strategies to promote healthy child development.

Partnering with Families to Address Challenging Behaviors: We Are All In This Together

This session focuses on developing strategies and skills to make these conversations more productive for everyone...especially the child! Participants will learn how to set the stage for and successfully conduct these difficult conversations with parents.

Preschool

Boy! Oh! Boy! Working With Boys in Child Care Settings

This training will help caregivers understand some of the needs of boys and the differences in their needs. Participants will learn ways to incorporate activities to help boys be successful in early child care.

Foundations: Early Learning Standards of NC Preschoolers

This workshop will describe the Early Learning Standards approach of Foundations and the expectations for the learning and development of preschoolers based guiding principles.

Promoting Social-Emotional Competence: Social-Emotional Teaching Strategies

This workshop will help participants understand the importance of being intentional in teaching social-emotional skills. Participants will define and identify emotional literacy to help children build their feelings vocabulary.

Helping Children Make Transitions Between Activities

For some young children, moving from one activity to another may result in confusion, frustration and challenging behaviors. This workshop will give some very practical tips to help children ease through transitions times that can be very challenging for young people.

Child Care Provider Almanac (Supervision Series)

All children will present challenging behaviors at one time or another. This module addresses this issue by teaching providers how to develop a plan to interact with children in manner that will prevent misbehavior, promote positive relationships, and guide children to self-control.

Nutrition and Physical Activity

This training covers the nutritional and physical activity guidelines for children. Guidelines can be incorporated into the everyday activities and will encourage children on the path to becoming health-conscious adults. Meal planning, conquering nutritional obstacles, and making physical activity fun are primary objectives.

Developmentally Appropriate Behavior: But I'm Supposed to Act Like This!

This session focuses on understanding when children can be expected to acquire certain social-emotional skills and guides participants toward understanding, respecting and responding to developmentally appropriate behaviors.

Bare Naked Activities: Get Creative With Your Manipulatives

This workshop provides participants with activities they can do with little to no money. Participants will be provided with ideas and will be given the opportunity to create activities of their own to take back to the classroom. Focus will be placed on using manipulatives.

Be Active Kids

This workshop will discuss Be Active Kids, a preschool curriculum full of innovative ideas for teachers who want to increase physical activity, improve nutrition habits and teach children about food safety.

Preventing Challenging Behaviors: An Ounce of Prevention is Worth a Pound of Cure!

This session focuses on modifications teachers can make in six key areas of the environment that will prevent and reduce conflict that leads to challenging behaviors.

Are You Listening? Communication in the Child Care Setting

This training addresses how to effectively communicate with parents, co-workers and children in the child care setting. It discusses how to be an active listener and will help participants understand how communication can make or break their profession.

Causes of Misbehavior: Why Do They Act That Way?

This session focuses on the common reasons that children misbehave, a crucial first step in determining how to prevent/reduce challenging behaviors.

Behavior Intervention Strategies: You Want Me to Try What?

This workshop focuses on helping participants develop new responses to challenging behaviors using six key intervention strategies.

Creating a Quality Outdoor Environment

This workshop will help providers implement outdoor play into everyday planning. It will also help determine if your outdoor space is quality.

School-Age

BSAC: Basic School-Age Care *(Cost includes manual, handouts and dinner-Alamance County only)*

This workshop provides comprehensive, basic training for providers with school-age children. Some of the modules that will be taught are: Quality School-Age Care; Positive Behavior Management; Age-appropriate Activities; Health, Safety and Nutrition; and Child Care Requirements and Regulations.

Bare Naked Activities (School-Age)

This workshop provides participants with activities they can do with school-age children for little to no money. Participants will be provided with ideas and will also be given the opportunity to create activities of their own to take back to the classroom.

SACERS- School-Age Environment Rating Scale

This workshop will train child care providers in assessing group care programs for school-age children (5-12 yrs) using the School-Age Care Rating Scale.

Other Topics

Family Child Care Home Pre-Licensing Workshop

This one-day workshop is a comprehensive review of the North Carolina Family Child Care Home Rules and Regulations and will be helpful to persons who are planning to operate a family child care home. The information presented will focus on family child care home licensing information; region specific zoning and sanitation requirements; detailed information regarding program start-up and operation as it relates to budgeting for quality family child care homes.

Professionalism in the Workplace: What Not to Wear

This workshop will address being professional and communicating a positive message with your image everyday in the workplace.

Business Basics: Recordkeeping for Family Child Care Home Providers

This interactive workshop will provide information to family child care home providers on the importance of good recordkeeping. Participants will engage in activities to learn how to stay current and prepare for their annual licensing compliance visits.

Polishing Our Diamonds: Increasing Our Value as Providers

Your diamond is the skill you value. This session is a hands-on exploration of how to revitalize your creativity and worth as a child care provider by discussing personal professional development options, assessing skills and creating plans of action to achieve goals. Don't get stuck in a rut! You can shine again!

Busting the Myths: Professional Development Seminar

Child care providers will learn how to utilize the NC Institute for Early Childhood Professional Development Plan to guide their continued education and early childhood careers. Professionals from local colleges will be present to assist as needed.

FCCERS-Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale

This workshop will help child care providers assess their program using the new Family Child Care Rating Scale.

Professionalism in the Workplace: Caring for Co-Workers

This workshop will address being professional and communicating a positive message by caring for co-workers.

Using Technology in Preschool and School-Age Classrooms

This training will help providers of children ages 3 to school-age use technology in the classroom as a tool to help with social development, language development and cognition.
