



T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Child Development Associate (CDA) Certificate Renewal Scholarship Programs



What is a CDA Credential?

The CDA Credential is a nationally recognized credential awarded to individuals who have demonstrated competency through both experience and education in working with young children ages 0-5. The CDA Credential is awarded to infant/toddler childcare teachers, preschool teachers or family childcare providers.

Who awards the CDA Credential and issues certificate renewals?

The Council for Professional Recognition (The Council) administers the CDA credentialing program and awards the CDA Credential.

Why does the CDA Credential have to be renewed?

The CDA Credential is valid for 3 years from the date of award. At the end of that period, an individual may apply for renewal. When renewal is granted, the Credential becomes valid for an additional 5 years.

Who administers the CDA Certificate Renewal Scholarship Programs?

The CDA Renewal Scholarships are made available through the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® North Carolina Scholarship Program and is administered by Child Care Services Association.

Who is eligible for a CDA Renewal Scholarship?

- Individuals earning \$18 or less per hour while working in a licensed childcare center or a registered family childcare home for at least 30 hours per week are encouraged to apply.
- Those applying for assistance paying the renewal fee must provide the completed original renewal application and copies or proof of all information listed below.

What do I need in order to renew my CDA Credential?

In order to renew the CDA Credential, an individual must fill out a renewal application and complete the following: a 3 credit hour continuing education course or professional education training courses, first aid and infant/child CPR certification, work a minimum of 80 hours with children ages 3-5 years in the past year, an ECE professional recommendation, and membership in an ECE professional organization.

Where can I get the certificate renewal application?

The certificate renewal application is available in the CDA Renewal Procedures Guide located on the Council for Professional Recognition's website at www.cdacouncil.org.

Can I complete the certificate renewal application online or do I have to submit a paper application?

At this time T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® North Carolina is only able to support physical certificate renewal applications. Since we will be submitting the renewal application to the Council on your behalf, we cannot accept copies.

What do the CDA Renewal Scholarships cover?

What kind of commitment is required of sponsoring centers (*Does not apply to home based professionals*)?
